Vera said an interesting thing: "Gate Gate Paragate". That means moving from one shore to the other. When we study the meaning of this mantra we hope that after reaching the other shore we can relax and stop our job. But as you can see reaching the other shore doesn't stop anything. We still have plenty of work to do, because sentient beings are numberless. So we hope to save them all. So the direction of this place is just this. Don't stop your work. Take refuge in this place and make this place refuge for the others. And try, try, try, ten thousand years. So congratulations again.

Don't do anything. Enjoy your place and practice here.
